Previously he has worked for the Agency for Innovation and Technology Transfer of the Academy of Sciences of Moldova as the Head of Policies and International Relations Department.



During his 2 Years commitment he has gathered extensive experience in working in the following areas of development: International Cooperation in which he created partnerships with foreign similar organizations and coordinated writing of projects for International Programs and sustained the country application for Enterprise Europe Network also as one area of development was to represent the interests of the Agency abroad by participating in international conferences and organizing international conferences in Chisinau (Framework Program 7 : Opportunities for SMEs., Innovation Networks: a new way for regional development, Workshop on "Key instruments in the development of the venture funds in the Republic of Moldova" etc.) At the Agency for Innovation and Technology Transfer he has promoted the idea of development of the National Innovation Strategy which was negotiated with some UN organizations from Moldova. The business environment faces difficulties in implementing the new provisions of the law on payment for environmental pollution and completing the reports on these payments.

The associative sector has called for the issue to be addressed within the Economic Council's debate platform with the Prime Minister.

At the meeting held on 2 May 2017, the business representatives addressed the ambiguities they have in this chapter with officials from the State Environmental Inspectorate, the Ministry of Environment, the Ministry of Finance and the Fiscal Service.

The subject was debated with the participation of the Ministry of Environment, Ministry of Finance, State Tax Service, LAPTE Association, UPZM Association, Franzelutza, EFES Vitanta Moldova Brewery, Coca-Cola Bottling Chisinau, CALM, Moldovan commercial banks, Moldcell and others.

Business representatives have mentioned that the biggest impediments to them are in setting taxpayers for environmental pollution and the complexity of calculations that businesses have to operate. At the same time, there are uncertainties about control procedures and competences.

Nelian Căpățăță, a representative of the State Ecological Inspectorate, said that this situation was created because the methodology for calculating environmental pollution taxes has been drafted in a very short time and is a complicated one, but which must be respected anyway.

During the meeting the representatives of the Ecological Inspectorate, the Ministry of Environment, the Ministry of Finance and the Fiscal Service came up with explanations regarding the establishment of the subjects for the payment of pollutant and waste payments, the calculation of the payments, the types of packaging and the administration of taxes.

At the end of the debates, the participants of the working group agreed that the Ministry of Environment will elaborate the list of subjects subject to the environmental pollution tax and put forward proposals that would streamline the collection of the tax.

At the same time, the Ministry of Environment and the Ministry of Finance will draft amendments to the legislation in force based on the objections presented by the representatives of the business community.

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
